Here's what emerged for re-worked goals language from January work session...

Goal #1: Protect all Dolores River Watershed water supplies by protecting the landscapes that support them. Safeguard lives, property, water-delivery systems, and other values at risk while improving overall forest health and watershed functionality.

Goal #2: Foster management projects in all forest types in order to support the long-term ecologic and economic resilience of the Dolores River Watershed.

Goal #3: Assist and strengthen the local wood-products industry in seeking out untapped markets and creating self-sustaining, cost-effective ecosystem / forest management projects.

Goal #4: Connect community stakeholders to better prepare for, respond to, and recover from a severe wildfire and resulting post-fire effects.
