## 1:40-1:55 Chicken Creek Fencing/Land-ownership dispute - Nick

- moving forward on resolving long-term, passed on to DOJ. Have received broad support across and beyond agency. engaging as much as can with community. responding to all phone calls and emails.
- wants relationship with community and that fence to never come back up
- Nick's goals as District Ranger: ecologically hold onto pieces, protect communities, keep support for public lands
- Now is a good time to express support for public lands. We don't want copy cats of this
  incident
- Robert Meyer Inspired by the community of diverse public land users coming together
  to keep public lands in public hands Chicken Creek Coalition newly formed to work on
  this issue. Have engaged in public awareness campaign sent over 60 letters to local
  and fed representatives, informational page on Mancos Trails Group website

- Robert requested coordinating committee sign a letter supporting use of public lands and that private lands claims are contrary to mission of DWC
- Steve Seconds that motion. Concern that Dolores County is next
- James this seems outside of our realm because forestry is our focus. Forest cutting off road access may have precipitated this. I want to stay on our mission, this seems off our mission. Forest Service has this under control.
- Nick what is scope of collaborative?
- Community is part of our scope and community has spoken that we want to protect public lands
- Danny I'm hearing a direct request for support from CCC, and we are built on supporting community. DWC has focused a lot on chicken creek landscape in past that

we have expressed commitment towards.

- Grant awarded and in contracting stage
- Contractor selection Team of Olsson, Wright Water, Round River, SWCA
- Overview of Project Area, Project Tasks and Timeline
- o Targeted end-date? 15 months once contracted, Marchish 2026

- Next steps for collaborative will include agreeing on vision, goals and objectives for WRAP and to review our highly valued resources and assets for additions/updates

### 2:45-3:10 Colorado Strategic Wildfire Action Program (COSWAP) WRAP Invitation

- DWC has been invited to apply for a 3-year \$1M COSWAP grant for forest projects in our WRAP footprint that will benefit water and water resources.
- 70% implementation, 20% planning and personnel, 10% indirect. 25% match (either fully in-kind or mixture of cash and in-kind). Application Due Dec 6
- Discussion of potential projects
- How do we ID projects and at risk areas by 12/6/24?
- We can generally describe projects that will come out of WRAP, and ask for \$ for other forestry projects that are already NEPA cleared, might come to fruition with a categorical exclusion, or on private lands.
- 3 years with option for 1 yr extension. Implementation should at least be well underway in that timeline
- Can't use on water or infrastructure projects. All veg: RX fire, mechanical, monitoring?
   (we will ask about that option)
- o Landscape, forest, water connection expected. In Dolores watershed.
- Would this tie into prepping landscape for RX fire with dozer lines?
- We have flexibility to be experimental
- \$700k could accomplish ~ 500 acres (\$1000/acre)Helicopter loggint \$15K/ac
- Contractor capacity? Absolutely have contractors to implement
- Silver Creek want careful planning for something that could happen later
- Where is most challenging to fund work to address, we have flexibility on using this \$ to get at places that are hardest to manage
- o Snowtography want more informed implementation that enhances soil moisture

- Some opportunity to apply some snowtography lessons on the ground
- How do gap size, BA and aspects influence soil moisture, runoff?
- NEPA ready projects
- WRAP identified projects
- ASCC sites has snowtography doing implementation to test different methods?
- Aspen Tx? District aspen EA
- \$ for contracting out Rx Fire additional burn boss, Underwood
- o Private land in West Fork, Lost Canyon, Dolores mainstesm
- Boggy thinning Tx
- House creek looks like a good priority area for snowtography
  - already have snowtography site
  - Has a SJNF Watershed Assessment, priority watershed
  - Water quality in McPhee is a priority
  - Recreational use
  - Bug trapping
  - Potential treatment acres NF can produce a map
- Does not include Beaver Creek drainage
